

#### Year Group Reward Trips - July 2024

A reminder that information has been sent to parents regarding the Reward Trips being planned for the end of the academic year, using the Evolve+ electronic system. The deadline for consents and payments for the Year 7 trip to Abbeygate cinema on 4 July, the Year 8 trip to Pleasurewood Hills on 11 July and the Year 9 trip to Pleasurewood Hills on 18 July is Friday 31 May 2024. And the deadline for consents and payments for the Year 10 trip to Thorpe Park on 11 July is Friday 7 June 2024

#### **End of Summer Term 2024**

The last day of the academic year is Friday 19 July 2024. On this day school will finish for students at 1.20pm. We are unable to change the timings of the school buses so they will run as normal at the end of the school day. If possible, please make arrangements for your child to get home by alternative means that day but if this is not possible, they can stay in school, in the Library, until the normal end of the school day. For lunch, a choice of pasta or sandwiches, will be provided for those entitled to Free School Meals or those who need to remain in school, in Ed's Place only, from 1.20-1.45pm

#### **Year 10 Mock Exam Timetables**

All Year 10 students have received a copy of their individual mock timetable today and a copy has also been sent to all parents/carers. The students will receive theirs via their school email address and parents/carers via their contact email address. Please encourage your son/daughter to **very carefully** check these timetables to ensure they know the dates, times, room and seat number (and tier of subject where applicable, as well as any exam access arrangements if shown) that has been allocated

to them. Any questions or concerns should be asked **before** half term, but due to GCSE exams running, queries should be directed to their form tutors or teachers in the first instance, who will then discuss with the Exams Team if required.

### Deadline approaches to opt-in for Suffolk County Council (SCC) Funded School Travel

The deadline for parents to opt in for SCC funded school travel for the 2024/2025 school year is 31 May 2024. If your child is eligible, you must opt-in by this date to ensure that school transport is in place for the start of the Autumn Term.

heard "The 57 Bus" by Dashka Slater.


#### The blurb:

"Two ends of the same line. Two sides of the same crime.


If it weren't for the 57 bus, Sasha and Richard never would have met. Both were high school students from Oakland, California, one of the most diverse cities in the country, but they inhabited different worlds. Sasha, a white teen, lived in the middle-class foothills and attended a small private school. Richard, a Black teen, lived in the economically challenged flatlands and attended a large public one.

Each day, their paths overlapped for a mere eight minutes. But one afternoon on the bus ride home from school, a single reckless act left Sasha severely burned, and Richard charged with two hate crimes and facing life imprisonment. The case garnered international attention, thrusting both teenagers into the spotlight. But in The 57 Bus, award-winning journalist Dashka Slater shows that what might at first seem like a simple matter of right and wrong, justice and injustice, victim and criminal, is something more complicated--and far more heartbreaking."

Please note: this book contains some unpleasant depiction of gender-based violence as well as reference to drugs and smoking and swearing. You may want to explore the content further beforehand.




#### **Mental Health Awareness Week 2024**
