First Chapters

KS3 - for Years 7 and 8, this week's First Chapters book is "Floodland" by Marcus Sedgewick.

Blurb:

"Imagine that a few years from now England is covered by water, and Norwich is an island.



Zoe, left behind in the confusion when her parents escaped, survives there as best she can. Alone and desperate among marauding gangs, she manages to dig a derelict boat out of the mud and gets away to Eels Island. But Eels Island, whose raggle-taggle inhabitants are dominated by the strange boy Dooby, is full of danger too.

The belief that she will one day find her parents spurs Zoe on to a dramatic escape in a story of courage and determination that is handled with warmth and humanity." KS4 - is "Orangeboy" by Patrick Lawrence Blub:

"Not cool enough, not clever enough, not street enough for anyone to notice me. I was the kid people looked straight through. NOT ANY MORE. NOT SINCE MR ORANGE.



Sixteen-year-old Marlon has

made his mum a promise - he'll never follow his big brother, Andre, down the wrong path. So far, it's been easy, but when a date ends in tragedy, Marlon finds himself hunted. They're after the mysterious Mr Orange, and they're going to use Marlon to get to him. Marlon's out of choices can he become the person he never wanted to be, to protect everyone he loves?"

Please note: This book has reference to drugs, though Book Trust rates is as appropriate for 13+ Feel free to discuss this with your child. If they do not win the prize, remind them that we have two copies in the Library they can borrow.

Online Harmful Content.

As a society, we continue to tackle Sexism and Misogyny and it will come as no surprise that social media is the avenue by which most people see misogynistic and other harmful content. In February 2024 a new report called 'Safer Scrolling' was released by Dr. Kaitlyn Regehr from University College London which contains useful, important data for schools and colleges on how boys are being targeted with misogynistic content, how social media companies are promoting that content and what we can do about it.

As part of the study, it is shown that after only five days of TikTok usage there is a fourfold increase in the levels of misogynistic videos shown to teenage boys in their TikTok 'For You' timeline.

There are similar concerns with WhatsApp and we know many of our students have access to this to communicate with their family and friends.

As with any app, the biggest concern is in the way students and others use the app. WhatsApp (like any messaging app) allows anyone to create an account. Young people can be exposed to inappropriate content and exchange inappropriate content with others. As with any app, young people will also use acronyms or slang to hide risky their behaviour. In time, the Online Harms Bill aims to makes sure social media platforms are held responsible for the content they host, to prevent and remove illegal content and stop children seeing material that is harmful to them.

Lavenham Literary Festival 1-3 November 2024

The 8th Lavenham Literary Festival will take place on 1-3 November 2024 with an exciting line-up of well-known authors, emerging authors and vibrant new young voices.

Here are some of the events that we feel may be of interest to students:

• A one-day creative writing workshop on how to turn fact into fiction and running a poetry

workshop to encourage those new to the love sonnet form, to write them "with flair and without fear."

- Three female Suffolk poets reading their work and debut authors Jyoti Patel, *the things that we lost* and Hilary Taylor, *Sea Defences,* will share their experiences with Janet Ellis.
- On the theatrical front, actor Janet Suzman and director Bill Alexander will discuss his book *Exploring Shakespeare* and take us inside the rehearsal room.
- Ashley Hickson-Lovence, whose latest young adult novel in rhyme Wild East, set in Norwich, has been named young book of the week by the Sunday Times, will discuss this and his novel Your Show, about the first black Premier League football referee Uriah Rennie – this work in freestyle poetry is teamed with kick-by-kick match reports.

The English Department recommends all of these, but especially the creative writing workshop and "exploring Shakespeare" session.

They have a student ticket price of £8.50 for most sessions this year for the first time, and there is a new evening and Sunday bus service to Lavenham from Bury St Edmunds and Sudbury.
