School Catering 2024

At King Edward VI School, we are proud of our catering which is prepared in our own kitchen by our own staff.

They love to provide a choice of healthy and satisfying lunchtime meals including our hot meal of the day, pasta pots, jacket potatoes with a variety of fillings and cold sandwiches. Prices vary, but our main course hot meal of the day is $\pounds 2.95$.

For best value, our meal-deal includes a main course and a dessert – which could be anything from our hot dessert of the day with custard, cakes, cookies or fruit/granola pots, or a drink. The price of a meal-deal is £3.80. Catering accounts can be topped up using our cashless system 'ParentPay', allowing students to purchase food at our tills, using biometric technology.

We want to make the catering at King Edward VI School as inclusive as possible. If your child has any special dietary requirements, we would be happy to discuss this with you.

Performing Arts Captains



Suffolk's Specialist Education Services are pleased to be able to offer this popular course. The eight 2 hour sessions will enable you to learn how to develop your children's understanding and talking.

Let's Talk with Under 5s

This practical course is designed for parents and carers but is also suitable for early years practitioners. Written by speech and language therapists these seven two-hour sessions will enable you to learn how to enhance and develop your child's understanding and talking. The course workbook is full of strategies and activities that can be used with your child at ho and in the pre-school environment. Helping your child become a confident communicator now mean that s/he is ready for all the exciting learning s/he will be involved in when school starts.

The aims are

To give you practical ideas to help develop and enhance your child's ability to listen, understand and speak.
 To learn why some children find it challenging to understand what is said to them and to talk.
 To help you develop your child's talking so s/he is ready for school.
 To share ideas with other parents and carers.

- Understanding what's happening when we talk to each other. Enhancing interaction between children and adults. Developing plays othat talking develops. Improving listening and understanding. Learn how kildren learn new words and help them use them in sentences. Learn how to ask appropriate questions and share books. Help children whose speech is hard to understand.

What the experts say

'Language at age two predicts reading, maths and writing when children start sch (Doff: report 201). 'Vocabulary at 5 is a very strong predictor of the qualifications achieved at school leaving age and beyond' (Feinstein and Duckworth, 2006).
