
Shanghai Visit – September/October 2024 Join us in welcoming our Chinese guests from 30 September to 5 October 2024.

#### **Attendance**

The Department of Education have changed their rules for applying penalty notice fines for children missing school. There is now a single consistent national rule for when a penalty notice should be issued. Click the link below from Suffolk County Council on behalf of the Government, outlining the sharp increase in penalty notice costs for repeated unauthorised absences over the course of **three years** of schooling. Charges to parents will be significant for term-time holidays and even higher if repeated in **subsequent years**. https://www.suffolk.gov.uk/asset-

The Department for Education does not consider a need or desire for a holiday or other absence for the purpose of leisure and recreation to be an exceptional circumstance.

- First Offence A Penalty Notice is issued for unauthorised absence the amount will be: £160 per parent, per child paid within 28 days. Reduced to £80 per parent, per child if paid within 21 days.
- Second Offence (within 3 years) A Penalty Notice is issued for unauthorised absence the amount will be: £160 per parent, per child paid within 28 days.
- Third Offence and Any Further Offences (within 3 years) - A Penalty Notice will not be issued, and the case could be presented straight to the Magistrate's Court.
   Prosecution can result in Criminal records and fines of up to £2,500. Cases found guilty in Magistrates' Court may show on the parent's future DBS certificate due to 'failure to safeguard a child's education'.

If you are struggling with your child's attendance, please contact their tutor in the first instance to discuss how we can help and support. The earlier we intervene, the more successful we are likely to be with removing any anxiety they have around attending school.

Regardless of your views on the fines please appreciate that if some children are missing from a class, then the teacher needs to reteach the content of the lesson at some point later in the year. This has a negative impact on the learning of all children in the class. It is for this reason that all children should be in school every day. Please support the learning of all children in your child's class by not taking holidays or mini breaks during term time and avoiding all non-essential absences.
