Artist of the week



Non-Examined Assessments

Child Development: Year 10 and Year 11 students are currently working on their non-examined assessment task (NEA) in class, Task 4. The focus of this task is 'bottle feeding'. Next week on Wednesday 2 and Thursday 3 October, students will carry out their practical assessments throughout the day in an allotted

45-minute time slot. Students must be prepared and arrive with their plans (including equipment, quantities/ingredients, safety, hygiene and a step-by-step methodology). This assessment will contribute up to 30% of the marks towards the final Cambridge National grade.

Food and Nutrition: Year 11 students have started working on the planning section of their non-examined assessment investigations (NEA1). The focus of this task is 'air as a raising agent'. During the week commencing 14 October, students will carry out their practical investigations over one day. On the day, students must be prepared and bring detailed plans and blank recording sheets. This assessment will contribute up to 15% of the marks towards their final GCSE grade.

Dates and time for NEA assessments will be confirmed with students. It is extremely important that they attend. For both assessments ingredients & equipment will be provided by the school. All written work should be completed and handed in before October half term. Details for all tasks are on Teams.

GCSE History WWI Battlefields Trip 2024

Early Friday morning, 42 Year 11 History students travelled to Belgium and France to visit Ypres and the Somme to learn about and see the key battlefield sites they are studying in History. We were accompanied by a WWI expert teacher and a veteran army officer, who gave incredible

insights into the history of each battle and brought to life the reality for men and women on the frontline in the trenches, the support trenches and the hospitals. At the end of the trip we visited Thiepval War Memorial, we searched out Cyril Groome, an alumnus of KEVI, killed on the Somme. Following a thoughtful speech from our military veteran, Rick; Jack Law laid a wreath on behalf of all the students and staff at King Edwards and we all held a minutes' silence. It was a very emotional and poignant moment for everyone. We couldn't have been prouder of our Year 11s on this trip: they were an absolute credit to the school. Many of the students vowed to return to the battlefields with friends and families to explore it further and ensure that the names of those who died here are never forgotten by King Edward VI School.

Year 10 Child Development Visitor

Year 10 had a special visitor on Wednesday. New mum Claire came into our lesson with baby Everly, 10 weeks old, to talk about their feeding journey. The students were well prepared with a range of questions ready to ask Claire about her experiences and to help them understand more about feeding a new baby. This links in very nicely with the classes current NEA task and gave a huge insight into feeding, the frequency of feeds, types of formula, the hygiene and safety considerations, colic, winding baby (to name a few!) as well as giving us some useful information about labour, birth, equipment, sleep

patterns, clothing and how routines and life has changed since having a new baby in the family. It was lovely to have a real baby in our lesson to give students an opportunity to listen to Claire's real-life experience and make connections to what they have been learning about in the lesson. Baby Everly was super cute throughout and was very interested in looking at all of the students around her and she even wanted to have a feed and burp during the visit, prompting more questions and interest from the class. Safeguarding Message
Last week Instagram (Meta)
announced, "Teen Accounts:
Built-In Protections for
Teens, Peace of Mind for
Parents" but what does it
mean?



At a basic level, any new accounts created by users 13-16 will automatically be put into a more restricted teen account which has built in protections which are:

- Private accounts new accounts default to private. This applies to all teens under 16 (including those already using Instagram) and teens under 18 who sign up for a new account.
 - However, currently this relies on users being truthful with their age.
 Instagram state they will be testing new technology with U.S. users at some point next year which will estimate age. This is poor, very accurate age-estimation technology has been around for years.
- Sensitive content restrictions teen accounts will be placed into the most restrictive 'sensitive content control' setting.

- Limited interactions users can only be tagged or mentioned by people they follow.
 Offensive words and phrases will be filtered out of comments and DM's (private messages).
- Time limit reminders users will get notifications telling them to leave the app after 60 minutes each day.
- **Sleep mode** Notifications will be muted between 10pm and 7am.

These settings can be turned off/on but users (16 and below) will have to set up <u>parental</u> <u>supervision</u> and those parents have to approve the changes. The parent supervision feature has been around for a while. New features within parent supervision includes ways to see who their children are talking to (but not the content of those messages), setting daily time limits, blocking specific time periods and see topics that children are looking at.
