
Dear Parents and Carers

Suffolk County Council (SCC) funded school travel for 2025/2026

If your child is eligible for Suffolk County Council (SCC) funded school travel, you will need to optin by **31 May 2025** to receive travel for the start of the 2025/2026 school year.

If your child already receives SCC funded school travel, you still need to opt-in every year.

If your child is starting secondary school in September 2025 and they are eligible for SCC funded school travel, you will be contacted by the 3 April 2025. You will need to opt-in if you would like your child to use this service.

If your child is starting primary school in September 2025 and they are eligible for SCC funded school travel, you will be contacted by the 10 May 2025. You will need to opt-in if you would like your child to use this service from 31 May 2025. Trips

Please see below summary and updates for some of the upcoming trips this year:

- Year 7 History: 1, 2, 3 July 2025 -Framlingham Castle Day Trip (Mr Bull). Enrolment remains open until the end of March. Funding is available to Pupil Premium students. ParentPay will not open until final numbers are confirmed.
- Year 9 Languages: 1-4 July 2025 Paris Residential Visit (Mr Ghali). Final payment is due 11 April.
- Years 7/8/9/10 Reward Trips: 17 July 2025. Enrolment remains open until end of March. ParentPay for Years 8/9/10 will not open until final numbers are confirmed. ParentPay is open for the Year 7 Reward Trip.
- Year 10 History: 19-20 September 2025 -Battlefields Residential Visit (Mr Shaw).
 Enrolment closes midnight Monday 10 March, and the ballot will take place on Tuesday 11 March to determine student places. A contribution is available to Pupil Premium students. ParentPay will not open until final numbers are confirmed.

Year 7 Easter Egg Hunt Fundraiser



To continue to raise funds for the Year 7 reward day at the end of the year we are hosting an Easter Egg Hunt on Thursday 3 April during lesson 4. Students will work in small teams to find clues around school and then collect their egg at the end. Tickets for the Hunt are £5 per student and need to be bought on Parent Pay or in Student Services by Wednesday 26 March. Students with poor behaviour will not be allowed to participate.

What is Cyberbullying?



Cyberbullying is bullying that takes place online. Unlike bullying offline, online bullying can follow the child wherever they go, via social networks, gaming and mobile phones. A person can be bullied online and offline at the same time.

Any child can be bullied for any reason. If a child is seen as different in some way or seen as an easy target they can be more at risk. This might be because of their: race or ethnic background, gender, sexual orientation, or it could be because they: appear anxious or have low self-esteem, lack assertiveness or are shy or introverted.

Popular or successful children are also bullied, sometimes because others are jealous of them. Sometimes a child's family circumstance or home life can be a reason for someone bullying them. Disabled children can experience bullying because they seem an easy target and less able to defend themselves.

Please talk to your child regarding online bullying and encourage them to have a zero tolerance if they witness it happening on social media or in a group chat, they are part of.
