

With 50% of all 9-year-olds in the UK owning a smartphone, and 43% of UK teens using their smartphones during school lessons; it is no surprise that frequent social media use has been found to increase a child's risk of depression by 27%. In addition, a recent Education Select Committee report revealed that one in four children now use their phones in a manner resembling behavioural addiction. Even more concerning, half of children have accessed violent pornography on a screen by the age of 13 and 21% of 9 – 12-year-olds agree that it is normal for children their age to share nude or semi-nude images online.


