

Why not ask your child to get involved in the next Open Mic, hosted by the Year 11 prom committee on Monday 31 March.



Chelsea's Story

As part of our ongoing Safeguarding and PSHE education, this week our KS3 students watched a performance of 'Chelsea's Story', an internationally renowned Applied Theatre Production that has proven highly successful in raising awareness around the issues surrounding Child Sexual Exploitation (CSE).

"It tells the story of a group of students who discover the diary of a girl called Chelsea. Chelsea was a 15-year-old girl who, having fallen out with her friends and family, met a guy called Gary. Gary was kind, understanding, had a nice car, had his own flat and listened to her. Unfortunately, Gary was not what he seemed to be! Chelsea's story is played out and examined by the students who, along with their teacher, attempt to understand what happened to Chelsea." (Narrative Alchemy)

Children between the ages of 11-15 years are most likely to become victims of grooming They may not understand they are being groomed because they consider their groomer to be a friend. Unfortunately, it does happen, locally and nationally. It can lead to sexual and/or criminal exploitation such as involvement with County Lines gangs.

The school's aim is to make our students aware of what 'grooming' looks like and if they or someone they know is in a similar situation, to let a trusted adult know. Educating our young people to look out for signs, enables them to make better choices.


Criminal Investigation Day: The Stephen Lawrence Case
